Astraios Chamber Music is built to be flexible, and that flexibility came in handy this year. We formed a musician bubble and created a virtual series designed to bring the concert experience directly to our audiences at home. Our videos were watched across the country and around the world. Our audience increased by 1500%.





Our third concert, "A Musical Menagerie," featured a special piano four-hands arrangement of Camille Saint-Saëns's "Carnival of the Animals." This video was re-edited and distributed to over 500 elementary schools across the DFW metroplex. We also created a special teacher discussion guide to lead students through the music.



Our musicians recorded a reminiscence concert which, in partnership with Jewish Family Services of Dallas, will be distributed to nursing homes and memory care centers across DFW this summer.


Astraios also received a scholarship from the Center for Nonprofit Management, and used the funds to create a custom-designed data management plan.

Quick facts:

- Our musician bubble included 8 performers across the year.
- Another 17 performers were featured on our "Twelve Days of Astraios" video.
- Tim Polster, our videographer from Metroplex Multimedia, used 6 cameras and 5 microphones to capture our concerts.
- We distributed approximately 3200 jelly beans for our Music & Silent Film concert. (That doesn't count how many were eaten at headquarters.)
